Born in Invercargill on 16th May 1936 to William Francis Bishop and Annie Catherine Black,

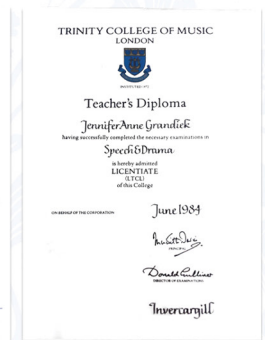
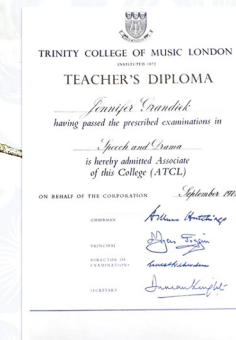
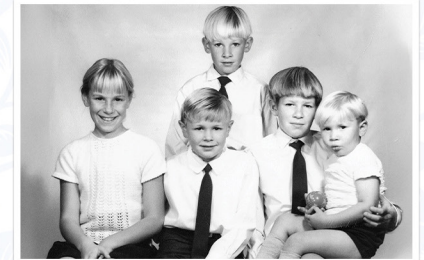
